CourseNetworking Expands Business in Asia: Opens Office in Kuala Lumpur

New office in Malaysia to grow business in Asia Pacific Region

CN services are available globally and are also free to individual learners. Other countries in Asia Pacific that have signed service agreements are Vietnam, Indonesia, Southern China and Palestine. In the United States, Purdue University and Indiana University among others, are using the CN.
